Tullie shot through the Buccaneer defense for touchdowns of 25 and 75 yards, and Neville kept his streak going by bucking over for another. End Bill Ryan pulled in a pass and went 70 yards to score his first touchdown of '59. Henry Babb kicked 4 extra points, but his fourth and record-breaking one was nullified by a penalty. Ronnie Elmore, Tom Crawford and Cloyd Jacobs consistently threw the Bucs for losses. Baumholder's lone score came in the final period.


Nürnberg lost its only game of the season at the hands of the Würzburg Wolves. Nürnberg's spread offense steamed up the field to push across Neville for the Eagle touchdown. Babb converted, but Würzburg came back to score. Bob Covington's extra point attempt was smothered by the Nürnberg line. Just before the half, the Wolves were able to score a safety, good for the one point victory margin. The remainder of the game was a hard-fought defensive battle with Tom Crawford and Curtis Tullie leading the way for the Bavarian Eagles, backed up by line-crashing Ronnie Elmore and Russell Hasis. Outstanding on offense were Henry Babb, Bill Ryan, Joe Tomblin, Tom Turnmire, and Loch Johnson.





Nürnberg bounced back with a resounding 30-7 rout of Heidelberg. Neville scored again for his fifth consecutive game. His place was filled during most of the game by star center Tom Crawford, who hit the scoring column with a 9 yard spurt through the middle of the line. Bill Ryan scored on a pass play, and Curtis Tullie hauled in another for a TD. Henry Babb kicked three extra points and a 27 yard field goal. Russell Hasis and Cloyd Jacobs headed an outstanding Nürnberg defense, while Tom Turnmire's three touchdown passes sparked the offense. Just before the gun sounded, a Heidelberg back went over for a touchdown.

The Eagles closed out the season with a 19-13 victory over highly favored Munich. Halfback Gil Frisbie intercepted a pass and returned it for a touchdown; Tullie scored another, and Loch Johnson, whose running kept the Nürnberg offense going, made a third. Babb's extra point completed the Nürnberg scoring. Bill Ryan, Ronnie Elmore, Tom Crawford, and Cloyd Jacobs led the Nürnberg defense, and Hasis' crashing blocks cleared the way for Johnson's powerful slashes through the Mustang defense. Neville's scoring record was spoiled when his touchdown was called back.





The Eagles got unexpected help when Mannheim beat Würzburg 26-6 to deadlock the conference between Nürnberg and the Wolves. The Eagles showed vast improvement through the year.

Much credit goes to Coach Campbell, who brought Nürnberg from the depths of a season without a win to Conference Co-Champions in two years, and to the team and Coach Davis. Co-Captain Tom Crawford was selected "Most Valuable", and Seniors Bill Ryan and Curtis Tullie and Juniors Ronnie Elmore and Henry Babb made the ALL-USAREUR team.



After the holidays, the Eagles traveled to Würzburg where Sutor's 10 led the path to a 34-33 victory.



Backing up strongly were Rick Lamison, Alex Panhans, George Kimball and Walter Jones.








