Because almost all text in this file has been reproduced through Optical Character Recognition, the viewer may search the document using the "Find" function of the PDF. 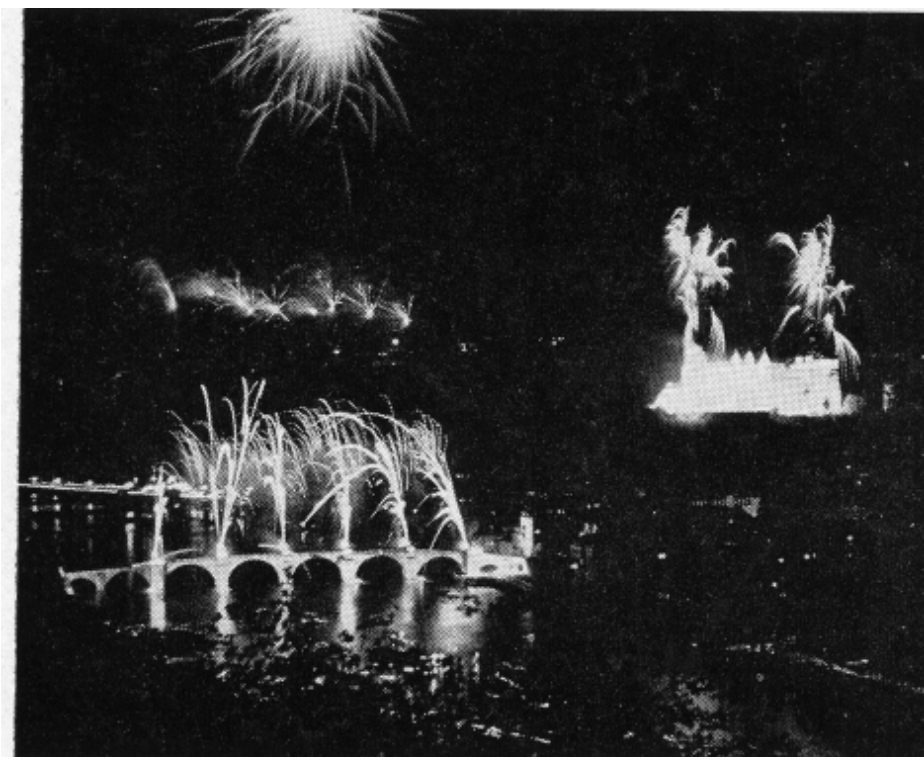

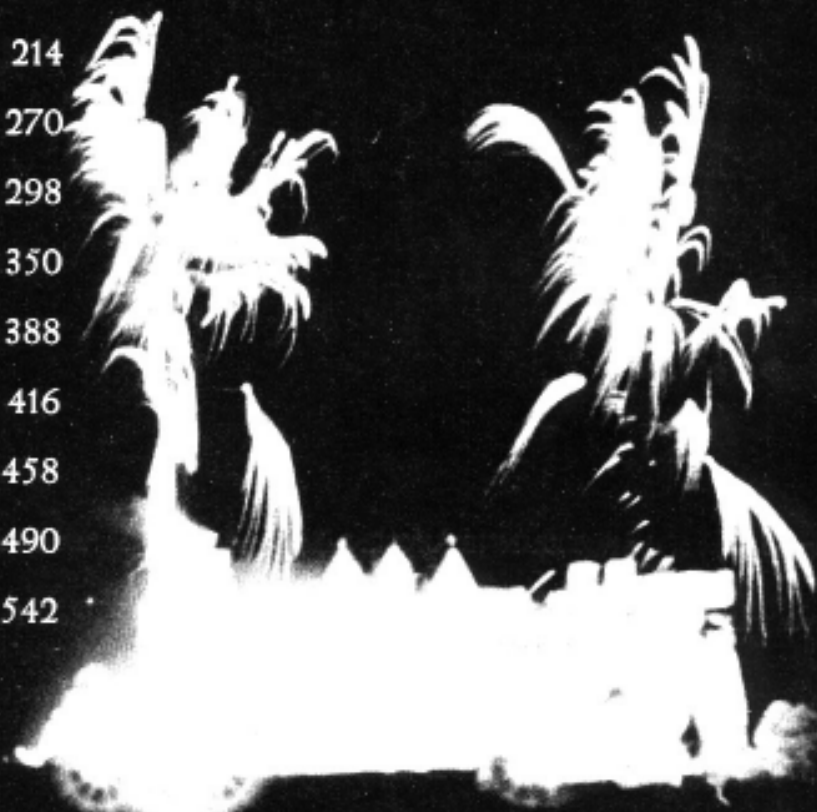

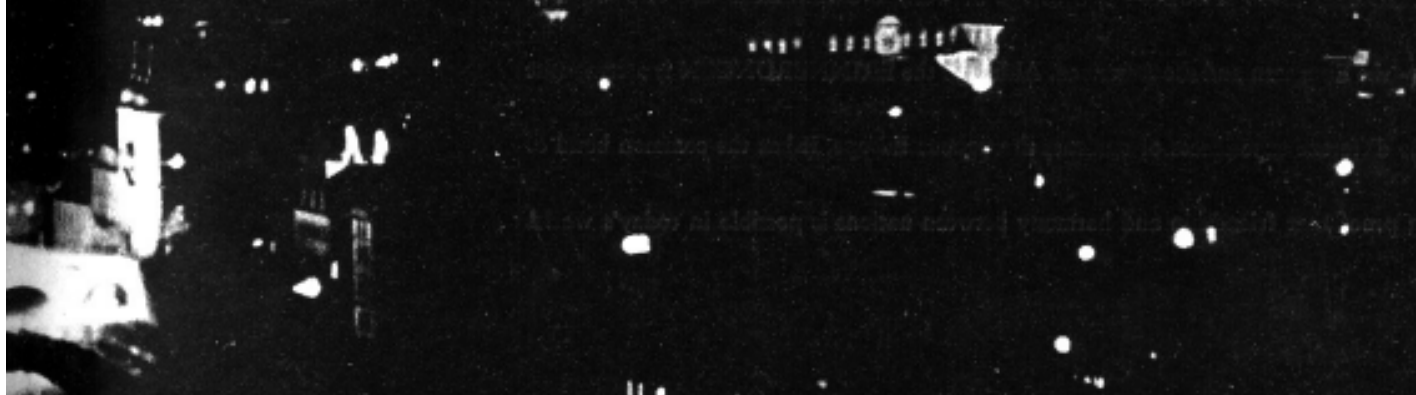

This tenth edition of the yearbook, which records the activities of students from fifteen American high schools in Germany and France — whereas the first edition in 1949 recorded only seven schools — is a bridge between two continents and two ways of life — the European and the American. Although the ERINNERUNGEN is a composite of the different experiences of students throughout Europe, it has the common bond of being proof that friendship and harmony between nations is possible in today’s world.

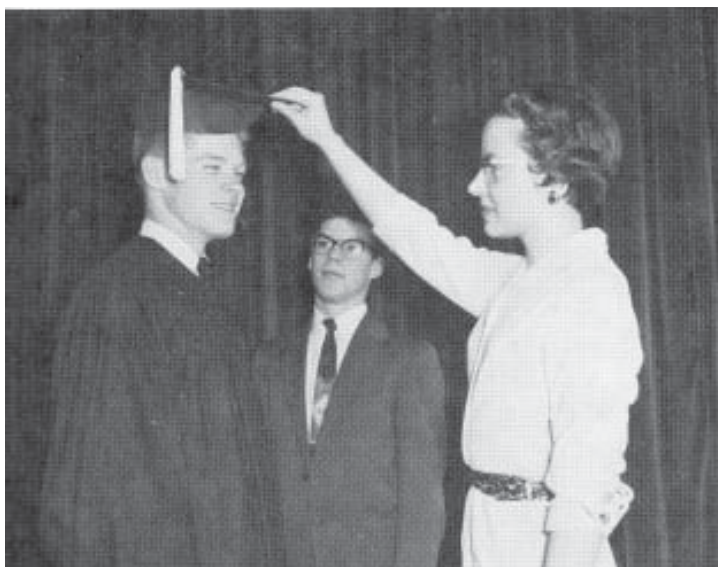
