1965 USAREUR High School Football Scene

Beginning with the 1965 season, the traditional conference that Nürnberg had previously played football in was abolished . Teams were placed in conferences based on their country and their size. Conferences were established in Spain, Italy, United Kingdom, France, and, of course, Germany. In Germany there were three divisions based on size: Blue, Red, Silver. NHS was assigned to the middle-sized Red Division, which included Heidelberg, Ludwigsburg, and Munich, Additionally, NHS played Wiesbaden (a blue division team), Würzburg, (silver division), and Augsburg (silver division). These games did not count in determing the conference winner.

NUERNBERG, the only other unbeaten team in USDESEA last year, bears watching again. The Red Division school is already leading the league, publicity-wise. We received a very neat, informative newsletter from Nuernberg a few days ago (wish some 30 other schools would do the same). Nuernberg is all set to embark on a tough schedule with a new nickname, a new head coach and six returning lettermen, including allconference halfback Ralph Kemper and all-star center Jack Benner.

The Eagles—not Green Tide—will be guided this year by Dwight "Dee" Hawkes, who served as Cletis Campbell's assistant during last year's all-winning campaign. Hawkes' assistants will be Steve Motta and Al Brunner. All the coaches have something in common—they've all coached high school teams in Japan. Nuernberg's backfield should be as potent as ever with the flashy Kemper and returnee Mark Norman at the halfback spots, Don Franklin returning at fullback and letterman Mike Pohler at quarterback. Guard Dave Kohutko and Benner are the only old faces along the line.

Nuernberg Blanks Augsburg, 33-0, as Ross Scores 2 TDs

NUERNBERG, Germany (Special)—Nuernberg High School rang up its second straight USAREUR Blue Division triumph, blanking Augsburg High School, 33-0 as Ron Ross scored two touchdowns and ran over three extra points.

Kurt Moore put the first Nuernberg points on the scoreboard with a 20-yard, first-quarter run, and Ross' first conversion made it 7-0.

Quarterback Mike Pohler combined with Jim Durbin on a 30-yard pass play for one score and Reve fan across another from five yards out and converted after both TDs for a 21-0 halftime lead for the winners.

Nurnberg Captures Red Division Title





 $N_{\mathrm{the\ explosive\ running\ of}}^{\mathrm{URNBERG\ }-\mathrm{Thanks\ to}}$ Ralph Kemper and Don Franklin, the Nurnberg Eagles downed the pass-minded Ludwigsburg Stal-lions 20-8 to wrap up their sec-ond straight Red Division title.

Quarterback Doug Drum of the Stallions kept the lighter Nurnberg defense hopping with 15 completions in 34 passing tries, but he couldn't overcome the brilliont running of Komp the brilliant running of Kemper, who scored all three touch downs for the Eagles in the crucial homecoming game here Saturday afternoon

Fullback Franklin set up the first Eagle score in the opening period when he ripped off tackle for 70 yards and put the ball in position for Kemper's short drive to pay dirt.

After escorting homecoming queen Barry Watkins out on the bield at halftime, Kemper came back in the third quarter to in-tercept a pass from Drum and scamper 74 yards for Nurn-berg's second touchdown.

Quarterback Mike Pohler passed to slotback Ronnie Hyatt for the two-point conver-sion that gave the Eagles a 14-0 lead going into the final period.

A pass interference ruling on the four yard line set the stage for Ludwigsburg's only TD. Halfback Bob Hampton skirted end for the score and Drum added two points with a pass to end Chuck Gary.

Kemper, an all-conference back for the past two years, closed out his high school grid-iron career by breaking loose on a 77-yard scoring jaunt off tackle in the closing minutes.

Although the score didn't in-dicate it, Ludwigsburg con-trolled the ball throughout most trolled the ball throughout most of the game, running up a total of 320 yards on offense com-pared to 205 for the Eagles. The Stallions also led in first downs 8-3, but the big runs by Frank-lin and Kemper made the difference.

Sophomore punter Tom Reese kicked a pair of 50-yard punts that put Ludwigburg's gridders deep in their own territory. Drum towered above the short-er Eagle defensemen, but they kept him to the short passes with a persistent rush. Leading the Nurnberg defense were guard John McKemie, tackle Ted Hedrick, and ends Fred Goebeler and Tom Reese.

It was the fifth victory of the season for Coach Dee Hawkes' gridders, who got off to a rocky start with a 30-0 setback at the hands of Wiesbaden in their opener, then suffered their only league setback last week to the revenge-minded Heidelberg Lions.

For Ludwigsburg, it was the third loss of the season and the second in league play for the Stallions, who finished third in the Red Division with a 1-2-1 mark. In second place is Munich with two wins and two losses in conference action.
