

Designed by ninth grader lan Johnson and put together by more than 70 students of art teacher Joseph Serino, the seasonal display unifies religious symbols from all over the world.

#### A COLORFUL PANORAMA

The big window front of the American High School on Fronmüllerstraße has again been decorated for the Christmas season. In more than two weeks, 74 students put together innumerable pieces of colored, transparent paper into an about 50 square meter large picture, which, under the motto "freedom of religious believes" shows symbols of different religions. Art teacher Joseph Serino, who has directed this annual Christmas activity for 16 years, had - in September already - encouraged the students to make drafts for the picture. Chosen was a ninth-grader's suggestion. Using a draft with a scale of 1:10, two students drew the motif on originally-sized paper patterns. All the students helped then to cut the transparent paper pieces to size and to glue them together for each of the 36 small windows. To make sure that all the single pieces fit together and form one large picture requires quite some skill, explained Serino. But the young people were very enthusiastic. Now all the ones involved in creating the picture hope that the many passers-by on Fronmüllerstraße

will share the joy of the participants in the successful work.
