CHANGES AS SCHOOL OPENS

The continuing drawdown in the Nürnberg community has resulted in some changes as the school year opens. The most evident is the consolidation of all of the schools to a single complex. There are now two schools serving the Nürnberg community. They are Nürnberg Elementary school for grades K through 5 and Nürnberg Middle/High School for grades 6 through 12.

Nürnberg Middle/High School opened the 1993/94 school year with 736 students. This year we have an enrollment of 387 students. There have been several programs lost as a result of staffing losses due to the declining enrollment. These include electronics and graphic arts as well as several course offerings. Overall, however, every attempt possible is being made to provide students with a variety of course offerings and high quality instruction.

Extra-curricular programs for which there is adequate student interest and faculty sponsorship have been maintained.



Closure Plans

The plans for the impending closure of Nürnberg Middle/High School, along with the rest of the Nürnberg community, are now more clearly defined.

The last day for school for students will be Friday, June 2, 1995. Teachers are re-working instructional plans to balance work between the third and fourth grading periods to eliminate the crunch of only shortening the fourth grading period.

Graduation will be held on Tuesday, May 30, 1995, at the Fürth Stadthalle.




The earliest date a student will be able to leave school with full credit for the second semester will be Thursday, May 18, 1995. Students who are anticipating an early departure are urged to contact the school's Guidance Counselor, Ms. Jessie Gilbertson, to begin an acceleration program to ensure that their work will be completed by the time they intend to leave. A copy of PCS orders is required for a student being placed on an acceleration program.

Arrangements are being made for the registration of Nürnberg Middle/High School students who will be attending Bamberg, Ansbach or Hohenfels High Schools next year. It is anticipate that this registration will occur in April. Counselors will be available to work with students and parents to ensure correct course selections and to make the transition to a new school smoother.

The closure of the schools in Nürnberg will end a forty-eight year presence of Department of Defense Schools in the area. There have been many inquiries from alumni, teachers and others who have been associated with the schools during the past half century. Some are planning to attend the final graduation and closure ceremonies. As plans are finalized more information will be disseminated to those interested in participating in the Celebration of Closure that will end the school year.

There is no reduction of classes or offerings contemplated as closure nears.


